- PIH serves families in New Hampshire who have a child from birth to 21 with a chronic physical health condition that:
- (1) Will last or is expected to last for 12 months or longer;
- (2) Meets one or both of the following criteria:
- a. Consistently affects the individual's ability to function on a daily basis:
  - 1. In the areas of emotional, social, or physical development; or
  - 2. In his or her family, school, or community; or
- b. Requires more intensive medical care from primary care and specialty providers than is typically required for well child and acute illness visits; and
- Is not a developmental disability, mental illness, obesity, or dental condition alone.
- Not income based



Wide range of services and activities that assist families in developing and maximizing their ability to care for individuals with special health care
